Executive Summary

INTERNATIONAL SECRETARY GENERAL

Y's Men International has proudly completed 102 years of service as a global movement, dedicated to serving communities and supporting the YMCA as a mission partner worldwide. Guided by the theme "Let Your Light Shine," the 2023/24 year was another historic chapter in the story of YMI, which was marked by the official opening of the new International Headquarters in Geneva. Our commitment to fostering international collaboration and driving organisational growth remains at the forefront of our efforts as a key component of our mission.

Throughout the year, we celebrated several significant events, including the International Council Meeting in Kenya, the International RDE Summit and Extraordinary ICM in Denmark, and Area Conventions held in Africa, the Asia Pacific, Korea, and India. Additionally, the Service Club Leaders Conference in Chicago presented valuable opportunities to enhance international service clubs' engagement and cooperation. These gatherings exemplify our dedication to fostering fellowship and promoting meaningful change worldwide.

As of this year, our paid membership stands at 21,793 individuals. It is encouraging to report that 83 new clubs have joined the Y's Men International family, including in new countries, such as South Africa, Botswana, Kuwait, and Rwanda, aligning with our goal to establish a presence in 100 countries.

However, a concerning trend has been observed in a continuing decline in international programme contributions. Despite this, YMI was able to donate CHF 10,000 from the Alexander Scholarship Fund to support the World YMCA's National Secretaries Training which took place in Kosovo in March 2024. Additionally, five BF ambassadors from Africa, Latin America, India, Korea and Europe were able to travel to Italy, United Arab Emirates, Central Southern Europe, Canada and Korea respectively.

To further foster global friendship among clubs, two International Brother Club relations and one Triangle Club relation were established this year. The International Council also approved 10 new Time of Fast Projects, with eight successfully launched. The Time of Fast fund also extended support to victims of

wildfires in Hawaii and Chile, as well as the floods in Nairobi, under the IP discretionary emergency relief fund.

In compliance with Swiss regulations and to maintain our international banking operations and tax-exempt privileges, we made amendments to our International Constitution and submitted an application for entry into the Swiss commercial registry.

Operational expenditures remained within budget. However, we incurred additional costs for legal assistance related to the constitutional amendments required by Swiss law. A reduction in dues income associated with the declining membership impacted overall operational income, but fortunately, higher returns from our investments led to an increase in our total assets, now valued at CHF 6.2 million. In addition to these governance challenges, we faced unexpected difficulty due to IPE Charming Shen's sudden health crisis which caused him to be unable to assume to the responsibilities of International President.

Significant time and effort were also dedicated to organising and promoting the 74th International Convention in Chiang Mai, Thailand.

This annual report includes the financial report, audited statements of accounts, and recognition of the various awards conferred upon our leaders and members for their dedicated service and contributions. The report also includes the newly amended Articles of Association.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to all IEOs, ICMs, ISDs, committees, RDs, DGs, club leaders, and staff for their exceptional leadership and unwavering commitment to igniting the spirit of Y's Men and leading the movement with dedication and passion.

2023/24 HIGHLIGHTS



Annual International Council Meeting

The annual International Council Meeting was held in Nairobi, Kenya from 22 to 25 July 2023. It was a historic meeting, marking the first international meeting held in Africa in more than 25 years. The meeting was warmly and effectively hosted by Kenya District with support of the Nairobi YMCA. Participants enjoyed an opportunity to visit the community centre at the YMCA Thika, partially

funded by a Time of Fast project grant in 2013. A tour of the facilities and an explanation of the current and future activities were provided. A ceremony recognising contributors to the project and inaugurating the facility was conducted.

International Council members considered 39 motions, approving 35. Two motions were withdrawn. Two motions, both related to extending dues discounts for young members, were defeated.

Over the rest of the year, Council Members were requested to vote electronically eight times. Two ballots related to the nomination of candidates for International President Elect 2024/25. The six other motions were approved.



International Headquarters



New Headquarters

The new 134 m2 office in Geneva, Switzerland, purchased in 2022, was officially opened on 27 September 2023 by IP Ulrik Lauridsen. The event was attended by various YMI and YMCA dignitaries, and local guests.

iMIS

Over the past year, the transition from the Portalbuzz membership management system to iMIS marked a



significant upgrade to our digital capabilities. After a decade of reliance

on Portalbuzz, its discontinuation by the parent company prompted the search for more advanced solutions to meet growing operational needs. Following an extensive review, iMIS was selected as the replacement, a toptier Engagement Management System designed specifically for non-profits and associations, aimed at enhancing efficiency and member engagement.

Simply Voting

Simplyoting

In 2023/24, a new voting system, Simply Voting, was introduced following the discontinuation of Scytl's 'Invote Now' platform, which had been used in international elections. After a thorough

evaluation of alternative options, Simply Voting was selected for its robust security features, cost-effectiveness, and compliance with stringent data protection regulations.



Amendments to the International Constitution

Following the rejection of YMI's application for entry into the Swiss commercial registry (a new regulation for associations domiciled in Switzerland that collect and distribute assets internationally), the following actions were undertaken to address the issue during the 2023/24 year:

- Discussions with commercial registry officials
- · Identification and engagement of a Swiss law firm specialising in association law.
- Drafting amendments in consultation with Constitution Review Committee Chair, Silvya Reyes de Croci, and Modernising the Constitution and Organisational Structure Task Force Chair, Bjørn Arve Bentsen.
- Circulation of draft documents and explanations to the Constitution Review Committee members, incorporating their feedback.
- Submission of the amendments, with explanations, to the International Council for deliberation at the Extraordinary International Council Meeting on 24 March 2024 in Denmark, resulting in unanimous approval by all 10 council members present.
- Sharing of the proposed changes with participants of the International RDE Summit.
- · Finalisation and refinement of the International Constitution for clarity and consistency.
- · Orientation sessions for Regions/Areas.
- Submission of materials to the clubs for voting.
- Approval of the amended constitution.
- · Resubmission of the documents to the commercial registry.

The 2024 amendments received overwhelming support, with 98.9% of participating clubs voting in favour. This strong endorsement reflects a unified commitment to modernising and adapting the organisation's structure to secure its future. The Modernising the Constitution and Organisational Structure Task Force will continue its efforts in 2024/25 to ensure YMI's framework aligns with current conditions.







Extraordinary International Council Meeting & International RDE Summit

In March 2024, the fourth International RDE Summit was organised in the home city of the International President who was happy to welcome more than 50 participants representing all eight Areas and 31 Regions. The programme included presentations on effective administration and operation of Regional projects, YMCA partnership and fundraising strategies, Regional project implementation and Extension strategy. There was discussion on CPE Institute, Y's Menettes Clubs, Y's Youth Clubs and Extension Beyond Borders, in addition to the standard orientation for Regional Directors Elect.

The RDE Summit was preceded by a one-day extraordinary Council Meeting to discuss and vote on the proposed changes to the International Constitution.





Club President Elect (CPE) Institute

In 2024/25 three Zoom sessions were organised on the following topics: Membership Engagement, Club Fundraising, and Communicating YMI. The sessions were well-attended and according to subsequent feedback, appreciated. In the second semester plans were developed to hold an in-person conclave in August 2024 in Chiang Mai, Thailand before the International Convention. One goal for the conclave was to begin the process of identifying trainers for Area and local level institutes.











The frequency of major natural disasters is increasing, and YMI continues to respond. In 2023/24, the International President Discretionary Fund used Time of Fast money to:

- Support to the victims of wildfires in Hawaii (USD 5,000)
- Support to the victims of Chilean wildfires Chile (USD 3,000)
- Provide flood Relief in Nairobi, Kenya (USD 3,000)
- Provide flood Relief in Brazil (USD 3,000)





International Convention 2024 Planning

Following the withdrawal of hosting offers from Bangalore and later, the Philippines, alternative arrangements were necessary for the 2024 International Convention. After exploring various options, a solution was found through the support of the YMCA and the Y's Men's Club of Chiangmai, with administrative assistance from IHQ. An innovative approach was adopted, introducing a unique programme that revitalised the traditional IC agenda by emphasising festival fellowship. Regular planning meetings took place throughout the year, culminating in a final site visit by the International Host Committee Chair and the International Secretary General in May 2024.






Per the February 2024 reporting, there were 1,467 affiliated clubs. By June 2024, there was a YMI presence in 76 countries, four new.








Roll Back Malaria (RBM)



Y's Men International continued its commitment to eradicating malaria by 2030 through the Roll Back Malaria (RBM) programme and the 2023/24 fundraising efforts. Re-evaluating its cuurent engagement with the Global Fund, YMI is developing a revised strategy that will increase direct involvement and organisational impact. We continue monitoring progress and evaluating programme impact with the support of our global partners, with a goal of scaling up our engagement in the coming years.

Durning the 2023/24 year, the following projects showed the following results:

TOF 23-01 Cameroon: Environmental Restoration for Adaptation

Several objectives were achieved for this multifaceted project—planting of fruit and nut trees provided food and income while also combating soil erosion. Local farmers were educated on climate change and the importance of adaptive and sustainable farming techniques. Three hundred participants were provided basic farming tools and learned climate-smart and bio-friendly practices which enhanced their productivity by around 20%.











TOF 23-03 Burundi: Female Small Business Entrepreneurship

Beneficiaries were selected and information sessions were held to outline expectations and responsibilities. Two income-generating projects were selected for funding using local raw materials produced by the chosen aspiring women entrepreneurs. One group is concentrating on the manufacture of soap and the other on pre-packaging porridge mixtures made from grains they have grown.

TOF 21-02 Rwanda: Community Pig Farming

TOF 21-02 Rwanda Community Pig Farm total of 18 pigs were purchased and a corresponding piggery to house them constructed. Two permanent staff have been engaged to oversee the activities and ensure the health and reproduction of the pigs. As of May 2024, 26 piglets had been born and will be distributed to deserving households when weaned.





TOF 22-02 Thailand: Conservation and Restoration of Forest Ecosystems and Sustainable Agriculture

Both a check dam to slow the flow of water during the rainy season and a fire break to limit the spread of wildfires during the dry season were constructed. Trees were planted in the watershed area to help maintain soil integrity. Efforts were made to increase awareness of climate change and its impacts using social media and other communication tools. There are ongoing efforts to promote organic farming, resulting in better forest preservation and sustainable agriculture practices.







TOF 23-05 Myanmar: Sunrise Farm

Between 2020 and 2023 at the Suan Luang Ethnic School two computer classrooms were built and equipped with 20 new computers and a projector. Computer Science teachers were engaged. In addition, a teacher's lounge and student centre were also constructed. Sports equipment for the pupils was donated. Plans are in place to use the surrounding land for vegetable cultivation and animal farming, selling produce and using the resulting revenue to support the school. To assist in meeting these goals, vegetable seeds were provided.





TOF 19-03 Jamaica: Y's Hope Camp

Key activities accomplished include clearing the land, conducting a topographical survey, organising an onsite workday, and beginning the erection of tent platforms. Next steps include deciding on the type of camper accommodation to be used based on budget and environmental factors, establishing three more water harvesting stations and piping water onto the site, as well as selecting animal resistant crops to be grown.





TOF 22-04 Slovakia: Human Resources Development

In the preliminary stage, focus was placed on the education of young professionals and volunteers at local YMCA facilities and strengthening networking and resource sharing among YMCA branches. To address various setbacks, such as the tragic death of the General Secretary, new part-time staff was hired. Strategies continue to be developed to train and motivate leaders to ensure an optimal summer camp experience for local youth in need.





TOF 20-03 Russia: No One Left Behind, Developing Wellbeing for Older Persons

Computer and mobile phone classes for seniors were conducted. Thematic meetings provided education on Russian history, architecture, and music. Minor repairs and upgrades were carried out at the dacha, which has gained a reputation as being a suitable, sustainable and welcoming venue offering social activities for seniors. The project is ongoing, as the YMCA plans to continue running programs for seniors in Nekrasovskoe and Ivanovo with help of volunteers motivated after seeing the programme in action.

TOF 23-08 India: Quality Education in Rural Schools

A deserving school was identified in impoverished Erumakkad Pathanamthitta. Nine quality wood benches and desks were commissioned using local labour and materials, additionally helping the local economy. The benches and desks were successfully delivered and installed on the school grounds, bringing joy to both students and teachers.






TOF 22-06 India: Preventative Healthcare among the Vulnerable

The Y's Men's Club of Panackapalam, in collaboration with the local Gram Panchayat government, meticulously selected a qualified teaching staff to facilitate computer training. Five computers, printers and various networking components were acquired. Tailoring accessories were procured to support training. An initial tailoring programme for 25 students and a computer course for 20 were conducted.





TOF 23-10 Colombia: Young Entrepreneurs in Bogotá

Despite significant delays in implementation due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the training programme for the next generation of YMCA youth facilitators successfully concluded with a graduation ceremony on 6 May 2022, inducting 21 (14 girls and 7 boys) as new YMCA youth leaders. During the preceding nine months, project participants from around Uruguay attended study camps, engaged in leadership courses, and had the opportunity to learn from past and present young leaders.





TOF 21-08 Chile: Seed capital and Work Insertion

Implemented by the YMCA with the support of the associated Y's Men's club, this project's objective was to educate young persons and women on how to develop and run small home-based businesses. Launched in March 2022, a series of workshops focusing on bread/ pastry production, metal structures creation and repair, as well as general small business development were held. The project culminated on Saturday, 25 March 2023, with an emotional award ceremony and delivery of seed capital of approximately CHF 510 to each of the five winners.opportunity to learn from past and present young leaders.





TOF 22-08 USA: Sioux Y Tiny Home & Twig Build


Following an urgent call for volunteer construction workers, by October 2023, 96 dedicated volunteers were working on-site. Despite challenges caused by a weakening economy, the YMCA surpassed its fundraising goal, raising over USD 270,000 by October 2024.

In 2024, the aim is to secure USD 100,000 from grants and new donors to cover essential components like tiny home and Twig furnishings, appliances, solar panels, and outdoor spaces.













Ballantyne Award

Community Service Awards

PALLIATIVE CARE PROJECT



Independent

In the Chavara block panchayat area, the Ys Men club of Chavara initiated a community service project in collaboration with the local palliative care unit, under the direction of Kerala's Health Department. The project focuses on providing aid to bedridden, physically and mentally challenged patients. Beneficiaries were identified through house visits and institutional surveys conducted by a special palliative care team.

Based on these findings, the club has been providing essential supplies, including food supplements, medicines, water and air beds, wheelchairs, walkers, catheters, urine bags, diapers, and financial assistance. Additionally, two selected families receive a one-month food kit every month. The aid is distributed in the presence of grama panchayat members, palliative care volunteers, Asha workers, and club members. This ongoing initiative, now in its third year, has incurred an expenditure of INR 3,60,000 during the YMI Year 2023/24.

Collective

The District 2 of the South West India Region (SWIR), in collaboration with the Ys Men Club of Dubai from the Middle East

Region, undertook a compassionate community service initiative as part of Ys Men International's "Heal the World" programme. The project involved helping a local carpenterwho suffered a serious accident in 2010, which confined him to awheel chair. Recognising his difficult situation, a volunteer team provided the funds and skills to completely renovated his house, providing much-needed improvements to his living conditions.









On 20 April 2024, South West India Regional Director K. Venkatesh officially handed over the keys to the renovated house in the presence of District Governor Dr. Alexander G, District Treasurer Ym Thomas Job, and Ym Benny K Mani. This act of service is a powerful demonstration of Ys Men International's commitment to supporting those in need within the community.

1 Applied accounting principles

1,1 Swiss GAAP FER (Accounting and Reporting Recommandations)

The financial statements are in compliance with Core SWISS GAAP FER, principally the SWISS GAAP FER 21. The balance sheet as at June 30, 2024 and as at June 30, 2023 complies with the Core SWISS GAAP FER.

1,2 Closure date

The closing date is June 30, 2024. The period consists of 12 months.

1,3 Accounting principles

The accounting, the balance sheet, the operating statement, the cash flow statement, the statement of change in capital, the notes and the accounting principles are in accordance with the articles 60 and other relevant sections of the Swiss Civil Code.

1,4 Current accounts and savings

Current assets are valued at per value less impairment, if any.

Several operating bank accounts are held in India in rupees for an equivalent amount of CHF 384'506,02. Due to monetary easing in India, concerning international membership dues and EF subscription, some funds are now able to be transferred out of India, providing that itemized proof of members is submitted. The amounts are confirmed by local accountants.

1.5 Investments

Investments are valued at actual values.

They represent portfolios of shares and bonds managed by Pictet Asset Management SA. Funds held in India are in fixed deposits account in South Indian Bank and Federal Bank of India. Interests are used to compensate the devaluation of the rupees.

1,6 Receivables and prepayments

Receivables and prepayments are valued at per value less impairment, if any.

1,7 Accounts payable, current liabilities, funds

All these items are valued at per value less impairment, if any.

1,8 Accounting policy on land and building

The depreciation is not applied for land and building

2 Conversion of foreign currency positions

The conversion of positions recorded in foreign currencies is performed using the current rate method. All assets are converted at the exchange rate as at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are converted at the exchange rate on the day of the transaction. The effects of the changes in foreign currencies are registered in the profit and loss account.
